A Ministry of Visitation Honoring Those Who Have Faithfully Served in the United Church of Christ

The Annuitant Visitor Program seeks to provide an annual visit to over 6,000 retired clergy, missionaries, and their spouses/partners in the United Church of Christ. Through these visits, Annuitant Visitors serve as ambassadors for the Pension Boards' benefits, communicate appreciation for a lifetime of dedicated service, and offer collegial support.

Today, all 38 Conferences have Annuitant Visitors.

Annuitant Visitors are usually retired United Church of Christ clergy. Visitors are assigned to call on a list of designated retired ministers, missionaries, lay employees, and their spouses/partners in a specific region. They have three basic purposes:

- Serve as ambassadors for the Pension Boards' pension, health, and ministerial assistance grants, either answering the questions of the person(s) being visited or connecting them with the resources to find the information they need
- Express appreciation for faithful—and often sacrificial—service on behalf of the whole United Church of Christ
- Offer collegial support
